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FLOW OF A RENOVATE SESSION

SOCIALIZE (10 MINUTES)

Spend a few minutes getting to know one another and catching up.

DISCUSS (10 MINUTES - OPTIONAL)

Talk about the homework completed the previous week:

Was anything helpful to you? If so, what?

What was more challenging than you expected?

WATCH (15 MINUTES)

The video session enhances the materials in the workbook by providing additional content on the topic.

DISCUSS (45 MINUTES)

The Discussion Questions provided in each session help participants explore the topic in conversation with one another. The questions are designed to allow people the freedom to reveal tensions or struggles with the topic, make personal discoveries, or think more about the subject.

REVIEW THE HOMEWORK (5 MINUTES)

The Renovate experience is different for each person. Some people may choose to skip certain exercises, while others will choose to complete all of them. Assure participants that they have the freedom to do as much or as little of the homework as they desire.

PRAY (5 MINUTES)

Sharing prayer requests and praying for one another is an important part of the experience. It is also okay for a participant not to share anything. Pressure should never be applied to disclose prayer requests.

Draw Up the Plan

SESSION 5: DRAW UP THE PLAN

When you were little, people probably asked you, "What do you want to be when you grow up?" What they were really asking is, "What do you want to do?"

We spend much of our lives creating labels for ourselves in an effort to define who we are. What if God created you with an altogether different identity in mind?

IDENTITY IN CHRIST

When you became a Christian, you gained a new identity. You became a new creation in Christ, and a child of God. In 2 Corinthians 5:17, Paul says, "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here."

Knowing your new identity doesn't mean you won't still be tempted to return to your old way of thinking and your old identity. If you continue to identify with who you used to be and how you used to act, you will continue to live the way you used to live.

CONCLUSION

How do you know if you are finding your identity in something or someone? Ask yourself:

"Would I be devastated if I lost it?"

"Do I want it more than I want God?"

Too many Christians don't know who they are in Christ and continually struggle to find their value in relationships, possessions, and accomplishments. As you read the Bible, you will discover the offer of a new identity. This new identity, however, is challenging to accept because it goes against what culture tells you to believe about yourself. In Christ, a new identity is available that is strong, clear, and unchanging.

SESSION 5 COMMUNICATOR: RODNEY ANDERSON


